Theology	Think of the people in your life who have led you to deepen your faith. Think of your Baptism, your First Communion, or other experiences with people that has had a profound impact on your faith in Jesus. Spanish	Choose your favorite celebrity. Describe this person and list the age, likes, dislikes, and personality traits of this person. Don't tell who it is until the end! When we return, we can read them aloud and guess who it is.

Some examples of newspapers include: The Chronicle Telegram, The Morning Journal, The Cleveland Plain Dealer, USA Today or the New York Times.</li><li>2. Using the same article. Make a list of all of the nouns in the article or print out the article and underline all of the nouns. Next, make a list of all of the verbs in the article or circle all of the verbs if you printed out your article. Then, change the verbs using a synonym for the original verb.</li></ol>
